Christmas package to the blind people in Teso region. To seal it off from the PVD desk, we recognized the unique opportunity of the swearing in ceremony of the first ever Magistrate, Willy Atono who is blind. We did not miss out on the opportunity of joining in the commemoration of the International white Cane's day in Gulu. We also reached out to the elderly people in Tororo with a Bible in their suitable format. These are among the articles you will read about this Light Newsletter.

The approved **contribution** Categories ranging from WOOD to PLATINUM for individuals and Institutions that will be recognized as key supporters with amounts ranging from Ugx. 1,000,000 to Ugx. 100,000,000 are gaining momentum. You too need to appear on this legacy record as the good Lord enables you. We do hope that the allotted shares to all major Church denominations in **Redeemable Preference Shares** as well will soon be taken up.

In the new year, we shall continue to hold meetings with a number of sister national Bible Societies for goodwill support in form of **grants** towards our building project. It is such a huge blessing that we have in stock the needed variety of Bibles in good supply and at affordable prices as required by our mission. Godfrey Loum who also doubles as BSU Acholi Branch Chair person as the 8th Bishop of Northern Uganda Diocese and The Rt. Rev. John Wilson Nandaah as 8th Bishop for Mbale Diocese. On a separate note you will read a story about the retired Rt. Rev. Dr. Elisha Kyamugambi of Ankole Diocese who is proud to continue serving Bible Society even when retired.

Finally, through our Life Membership appeal and story in this newsletter, do consider becoming one. At the end of this year, we plan to publish the fully paid up Life Members as part of the key contributors to the new Bible House. Contacts and details are available here for you to do the needful. The dawn of 21st November 2021 got thousands of Christians thronging St. Phillips Cathedral Gulu City to witness the consecration and enthronement of the 08th Bishop of the Diocese of Northern Uganda Rt. Rev. Godfrey Loum, who has been the first and is still the Chairman of BSU Acholi Branch.

On this day, Rt. Rev. Godfrey Loum was consecrated and enthroned by His Grace Dr. Stephen Kazimba Mugalu The Archbishop of the Church of Uganda amidst jubilation from thousands of Christians as he succeeded Rt. Rev. Johnson Gakumba who had been the 7th Bishop of the Diocese of Northern Uganda Since 2009. During this momentous occasion,

His Grace Dr. Stephen Kazimba Mugalu was joined by Rt. Rev. Henry Luke Orombi the 7th Archbishop of the Church of Uganda. The ceremony was marked with pomp and splendor as it was graced by Rt. Hon. Jacob Oulanyah, the Speaker of Parliament of Uganda as the Chief Guest representing His Excellency Yoweri Kaguta Museveni, the President of the Republic of Uganda. The Speaker was accompanied by The Chief Justice of Uganda Alfonse Owiny-Dollo, government ministers, members of parliament from within Acholi sub-region and district officials.

The Bible Society of Uganda was accorded the reading of the day and this golden opportunity was well maximized by Mr. Simon Peter Mukhama, the General Secretary and his team. Before the reading, Mr. Simon Peter Mukhama

informed the Christians that the Braille Bible is now available in Acholi Language, a big milestone that wouldn't be possible without the generous contributions of Life members. This news attracted an enthusiastic applause from the congregation. Immediately, the reading was taken by a completely blind boy using the Acholi Braille Bible that was officially launched on 20th November 2021. Many were left astonished and applauded the 14 year old visually impaired Ogenrwot Martin after eloquently taking the reading in Acholi language. To a sighted person, it was just unbelievable that a blind person could read so easily and swiftly like Martin did and indeed Martin's ability to read the Acholi Braille Bible was proof that God is not limited by our sight!

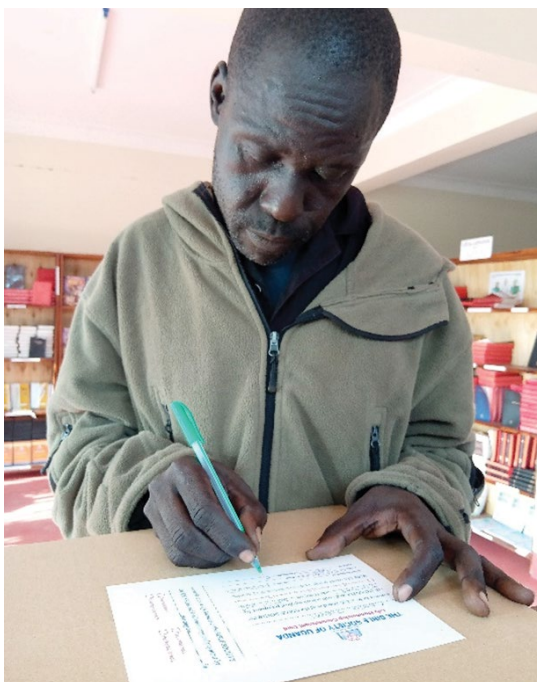

My motivation to become a life member

Mr. Odong Robert is a person with Low Vision and so far he has been able to access a big lettered Pulpit Bible from The Bible Society of Uganda to aid his reading and study of the bible. On the very day he acquired his Pulpit Bible, he encountered Mr. Owiyo Patrick who is totally blind holding a different kind of Bible at BSU Acholi Branch office and this got him a bit puzzled as he wondered the possibility of a blind person reading.

It had never dawned on him that there also exists a Bible for the totally blind persons in the format called "Braille". To satisfy his curiosity he requested Mr. Owiyo to read to him his favorite Bible Chapter Genesis 1:1-31, His request was granted in no minute as Mr. Owiyo read through the braille Bible so fast and with great ease. "Wow, what an

impressive read from a totally blind person! Mr. Odong Exclaimed".

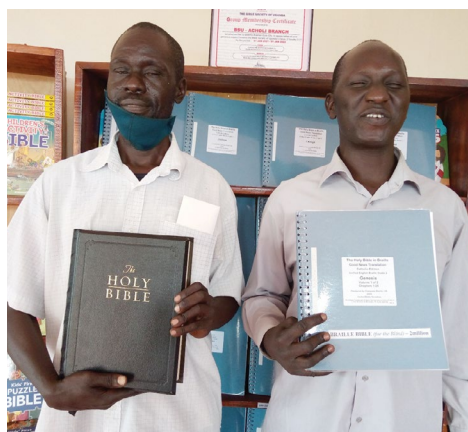
Mr. Odong later learnt that Mr. Owiyo was only holding the book of Genesis and to make a full Bible from Genesis up to the book of Revelations, there would be need for more 40 books similar to what Mr. Owiyo was holding which costs Shs.2,000,000 (Two million Shillings). He wondered where Mr. Owiyo got 2million shillings to purchase his braille bible but to his surprise, The Bible Society of Uganda gave it to him at no cost through the continued support from life members who pay a one-time lump sum of 1million shillings each. "I am ready to become a life member of the Bible Society of Uganda if it is what will help the blind get access to free braille Bibles.

If I can pay fees for my children at school, farm and get millions of shillings after receiving free rain from God, then why not pick only 1million and help a blind person through my life membership

subscription?" Says Robert. Immediately, Robert subscribed to become a Life member with a commitment to start his payment in January 2022.

Strangely, Robert returned to office after 2 days with 1million shillings ready to pay up his life membership. Today, Mr. Odong Robert is a fully paid up Life Member, a journey motivated by witnessing a blind person read a bible and the need to support them.

In Uganda today, there are about 2.6 million blind people and all these need braille Bibles in languages that communicate effectively to them. To date, The Bible Society of Uganda has translated and produced Braille Bibles in English, Luganda, Runyankore-Rukiga and Acholi Languages each copy costing shs. 2million. By becoming a life member, you will be supporting a blind person to receive a braille Bible at no cost from The Bible Society of Uganda.

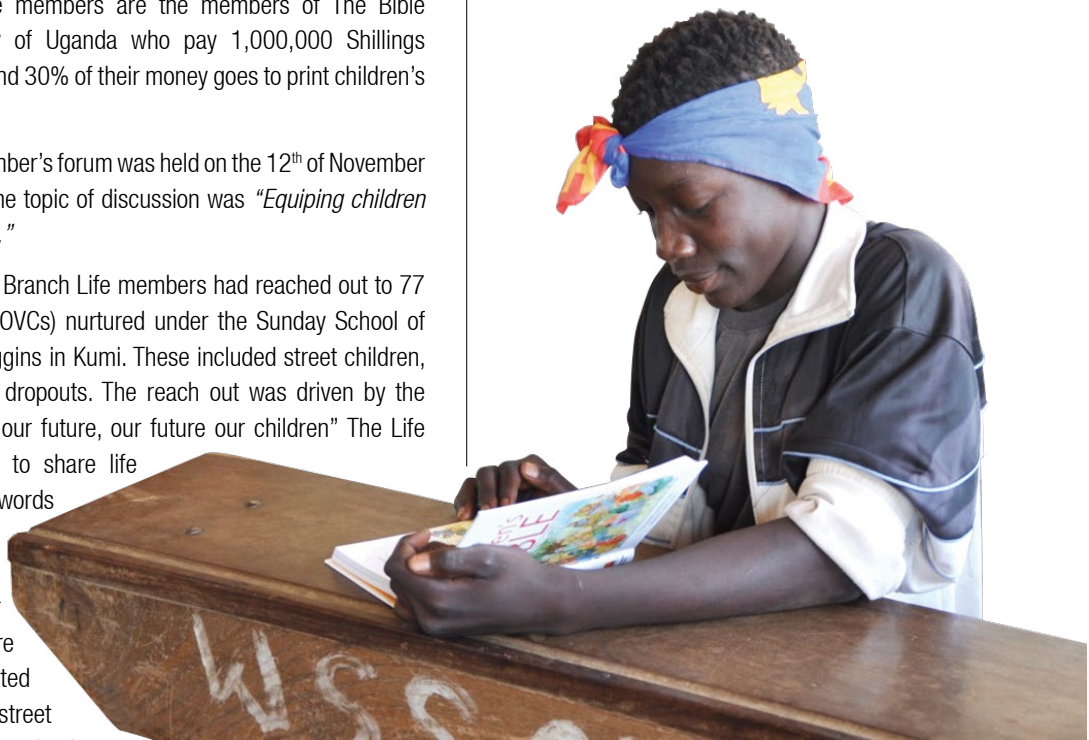
Our Children Our Future

The Life members are the members of The Bible Society of Uganda who pay 1,000,000 Shillings once and 30% of their money goes to print children's Bibles.

This year the Life member's forum was held on the 12th of November 2021 on zoom and the topic of discussion was *"Equipping children with the Word of God."*

Early in the day, Teso Branch Life members had reached out to 77 Vulnerable Children (OVCs) nurtured under the Sunday School of St. Luke's C.O.U Wiggins in Kumi. These included street children, orphans, and school dropouts. The reach out was driven by the theme "Our children our future, our future our children" The Life members were able to share life changing stories and words of encouragement with the children. Three (3) former street children who are now in school motivated other seven (7) street children to go back to school, come January 2022.

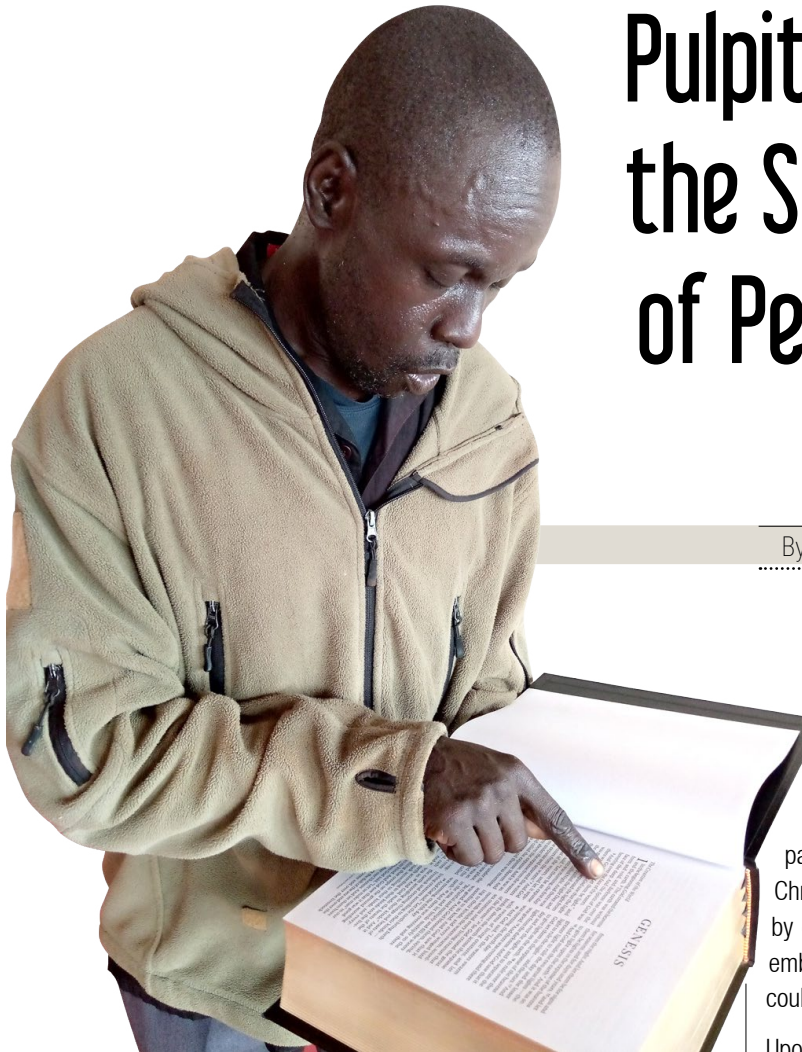

Pulpit Bible Meeting the Scripture Needs of Person with Low Vision

For over 23 years, Mr. Odong Robert has been struggling to read the Bible due to low vision, a condition which started in 1998 as a result of frequent use of computer screen. Mr. Odong acquired an eye glass to aid his reading of the bible, but this made things even worse as he would feel intense pain whenever he used them. Being a Christian at Christ Church Gulu, he needed to keep his faith growing by continuing to engage with the Bible and hence, He embarked on a hunt for a Bible with big letters which could easily be read without using an eye glass.

Upon Visiting The Bible Society of Uganda Acholi Branch office in Gulu City, Mr. Odong was met with the biggest surprise of his life, the big lettered Pulpit Bible. To him, it was a dream come true as he narrated, *"This is exactly the kind of Bible I have been searching for over 10 years, I thought it would cost me more than one million (1,000,000) shillings to acquire it but am surprise it costs only 250,000 shillings at Bible Society which is very affordable considering its huge size and big letters. I am very happy to have this Bible today because I will now begin to read it in church during the sermon and also when am back home during my personal Bible study.*

The pulpit bible is the perfect Bible for any person with low vision like me and I appeal to Bible Society to consider making one in Acholi language in order to reach out to more persons with low vision in Acholi land who can't read English Bibles fluently. Thank you Bible Society for making God's word accessible and affordable". Says Mr. Odong Robert

The Pulpit Bible is a Bible that is huge in size and ideal for; persons with low vision, church pulpit and family devotions.

Wherever Bible Society Ministers, I am with them

The Rt. Rev. Dr. Elisha Kyamugambi, retired Bishop of Ankole Diocese (1992 – 2007) narrates the reason why together with his wife, decided to become Life Members of The Bible Society of Uganda.

In the 1980s, I was in the United Kingdom and as I visited Christians, one elderly woman told me that she had desired to go to Africa and preach the gospel but she failed and age had already caught up with her as she could not even manage to take a flight.

“Now since I cannot now go to Africa and God has granted me the opportunity to meet you, you will be the one to go for me.” She said. She then picked a U.K Pound, gave it to me and said; “Go in peace, wherever you stand at the pulpit to preach the gospel, I will also be with you.”

That old woman challenged me greatly, increased my salvation and I was filled with joy. When I came back to Uganda, I couldn't afford to keep quiet but told many people what the old woman had told me. That was a great gospel and I encourage all people, if you cannot do something on your own, get someone else, who has the capacity to go and do it. There are those who have no energy to do ministry and other have resources but are unable to reach out, get someone else and equip them to go and do it for you; then you thank God and continue praying for them.

In November 2016, while in a meeting for Bishops, a team came and told us about Bible Society and what they do. It's then that I got to know more details about Bible Society and that they preach the gospel through outreach to communities in Uganda and beyond with the Word of God and also help people who have even never heard about Christ to know God through the Bible. I was touched and together with my wife we decided to become Life Members by paying Ugx 1,000,000= each. Just like the old woman, we too joined Bible Society to reach out.



I am now convinced that wherever Bible Society of Uganda does an outreach or translates any Bible, I am always with them, I pray for them and I am also encouraging more people; beginning with my family to become Life members as well, so that we have the Bible reach out to more people in Uganda and beyond.



Meet the New Visually Impaired Magistrate

“Bible Society of Uganda donates a braille Bible as a tool to be used to administer justice”

His worship Willy Atono, goes into history as the first Visually Impaired magistrate in Uganda, following his appointment. His selection as Grade One Magistrate, was done by the Judicial Service Commission (JSC), a government body mandated to recruit judicial officers and discipline errant ones.

Part of his job now as a Grade One Magistrate will require hearing of cases filed in court as well as coming up with judgments and rulings. He first learnt of the job offer in 2019 after a friend notified him about it. Despite being visually impaired, a disability he was born with, Mr. Atono said he handled the application process by himself with no extra help. How? One wonders.

“I would admire people presiding over cases during my adulthood years,” the 35-year old magistrate said Atono. He added “The work of a magistrate gives me some level of satisfaction. I want to work and rise through the ranks to Justice of the Supreme Court.”

“I relied on a software designed in my laptop that has a voice command that guided and gave me instructions to follow when I was typing the application,” he said.

Mr Atono added: “Typing was very easy as I am currently familiar with where the buttons are placed on my laptop. My fingers know their way around the keyboard even when I can't see.”

Fortunately, Mr Atono passed the written interview stage before becoming eligible for an oral assessment, which he also sailed through before eventually being appointed into his

current role. He has been deployed to the Chief Registrar's Chambers.

Bible Society of Uganda was present during the swearing in ceremony and distributed a braille Bible to him as one of the tools to be used to administer justice in his work. This is a miracle to us through the people with Visual Impairment (PVD) project that distributes braille Scriptures to visually impaired people in Uganda.

International White Cane's Day is celebrated every year on October 15 to recognize the importance of White Cane for People with Visual Impairment, who want to safely travel and maintain their independence.

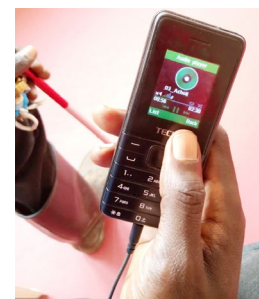
Prior to the event, the Bible Society of Uganda held a PVD Sensitization talk show on Radio Favor and the testimonies from the listeners were so encouraging. During the event, The Bible Society of Uganda distributed free Audio Scriptures and Trauma Healing Episodes to the Visually Impaired directly into their phones through memory cards. These audio scriptures help to build up their Faith in God and the trauma healing episodes help to heal the wounds within the hearts of the visually impaired that have been caused by different traumatic experiences. Before the event could close, 5 people gladly became Life members of Bible Society.

The event was crowned up by an Exhibition of the different tools used by the Visually Impaired and it's at this point that the Braille Bible displayed

by Bible Society featured prominently that left the Chief Guest Hon. Asamu Hellen Grace State Minister for PWDs very impressed that she stared over the Braille Bible with a feeling of awe. Other guests who graced the event were Hon. Achan Joyce Okeny MP for PWDs, Mr. Odongpiny Denis Odwong the Gulu City RCC, and Mr. Kinubi Francis UNAB Chairman.

The Acholi Braille Bible Launched

The Bible Society of Uganda launched the Acholi braille Bible in Gulu City, Northern Uganda at a function that was attended by church leaders and people with Visual Impairment. This is the third braille Bible in local language after Runyakore -Rukiga that was launched last year. Persons with Visual Impairment that attended the function were very happy to receive the Bible in their local language Acholi.

Something profound happens when a community receives braille Scriptures in their language. People feel that God is speaking directly to them, and from among them. "God speaks my language!" is a common joyful reaction from the PVD Project beneficiaries. As we distribute braille Scriptures we have always seen how the braille Bible changes people's lives - It changes character, families, communities and it can change the whole country.

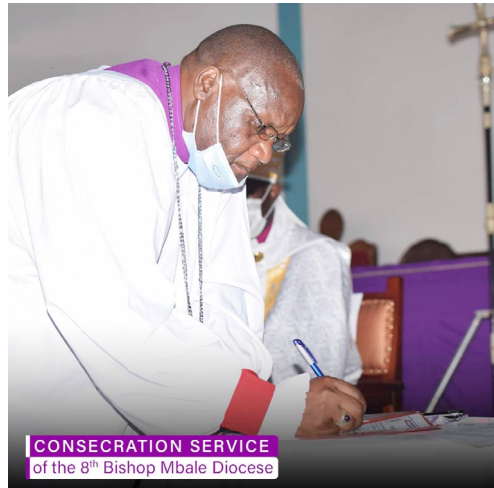

The Bible Society of Uganda through the PVD engagement project continue to carry out Church Leader’s sensitization workshops in various regions of Uganda. Mr. Isaac Tusubira told church leaders of the presence of People With Visual Impairment in their congregations, what they are capable of plus the role of the PVD Project. He noted that blind individuals are present and yet invisible neighbors in our communities and that this gap is being covered by distribution of braille Scriptures.

THEME: A BIBLE FOR EVERY CHILD

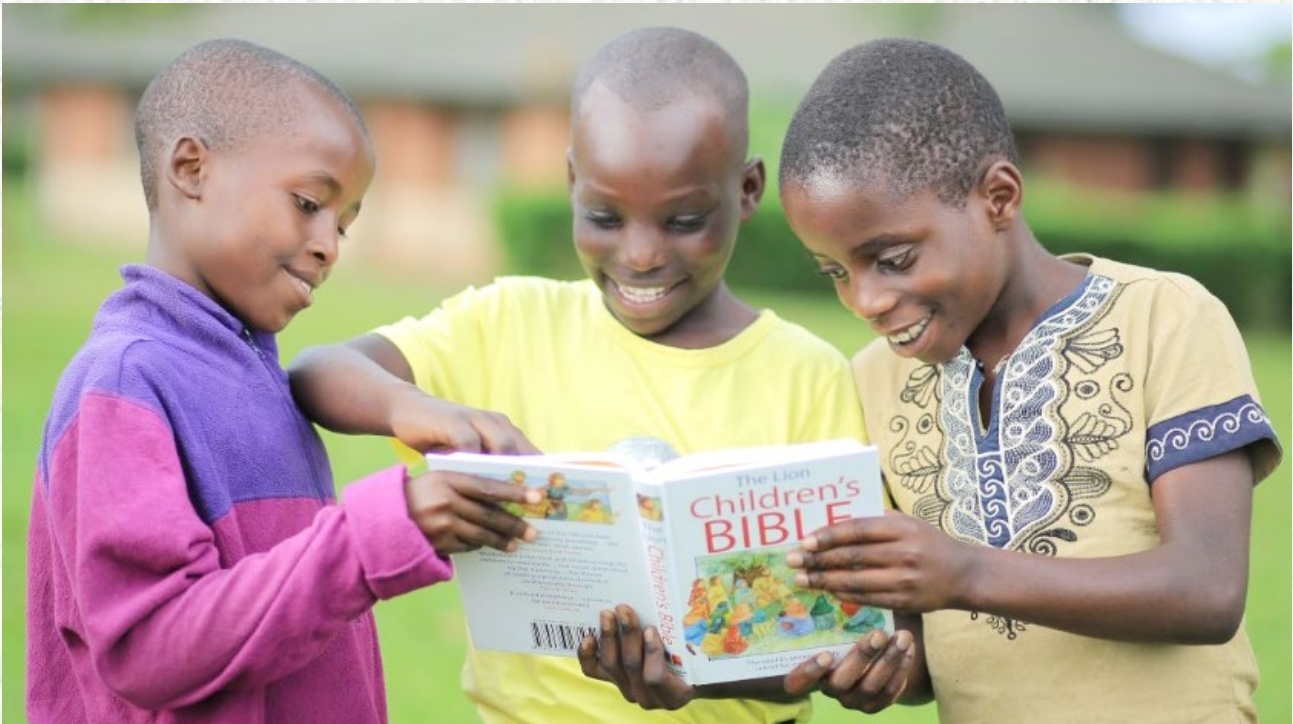

KAMPALA

It was a great joy at Katalamwa Cheshire Home of Children with disabilities where children received Bibles for the very first time in their lives. The Lion Children Bibles were distributed to 37 in patient children battling different disabilities. The life members together with a team from Bible Society led by the General Secretary were touched by the smiles on the faces of the hopeless children and care takers.

"Thank you Bible Society for remembering us at such a time as this!" One of the care takers mentioned as she received the gifts. Now that we have Bibles, the care takers can read for the children daily. For now the scriptures will restore hope in the lives of the children.





RWENZORI

Amidst the heavy rains that befell Fort Portal tourism city in the afternoon, nothing could stop the Life members to reach out to the amazing children of SOS Children’s village. The Village runs two programs; the family care which takes care of 116 children and family strengthening gap that looks after 1,033 stay home children.

Five (5) Life Members joined the rest of the team from the Rwenzori Branch that included part of the Executive committee members. The team was over joyed by the different presentations by the children. “Our sincere appreciation to Bible Society of Uganda for making this day memorable. Thank you for remembering us.”

ANKOLE

“We had only one children’s Bible, thank you Bible Society of Uganda for equipping our children with the Word of God.” This was said by the caretaker of Devine Mercy Children’s Home in Mbarara City as she received 20 Children Bibles during the outreach to Valuable Children in November 2021 by the Bible Society of Uganda (BSU).

Trust Children Project, which takes cares of children picked from the streets also received 30 Children to help them engage meaningfully with the Word of God. The former street children, who are now called church children were filled with joy as each received a Bibles of their own for the first. Apostle Willy Tumwiine of Holy Spirit Fire Church, who is the vision bearer of Trust Children Project appreciated BSU for thinking about them and availing the Word of God to the children under his care.





TESO

Teso branch team, visited St. Luke's Wiggins church in Kumi where we reached out to 77 vulnerable children (OVCs) being nurtured under the Sunday school. These included street children, orphans and school dropouts. 50 children's Bibles were distributed.

The children were reached out to under the slogan "Our children our future." Three former street children of these, now enrolled in school, have motivated seven others to go back to school come January 2022 of which some of these were Muslims.



ACHOLI

The Bible Society of Uganda – Acholi Branch identified a local organization whose heart was set on heeding the plight of at risk children; orphans, child mothers, widows and child headed homes. Alpha and Omega Children Restoration Center in Pader had seen firsthand the adverse effects of Trauma on family with its worst brunt on the children. Needless to say, the decades old violence, atrocity and ferociousness of the LRA inescapable in their story, evidence of generational trauma passed down.

Monica Adong, a mother of three and vision bearer of the Children restoration center in Pader, an orphan herself and survivor of child neglect leads this organization which makes every effort to help children as best they can and provide for them as God provides for her. "My heart is crushed when I see children without any support for their life. With the little God has given me, as long as I breathe, I will fight for these children." Monica asserts.

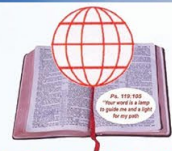

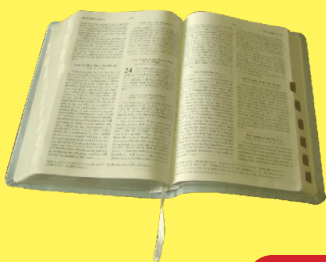
